

BUCKS COUNTY COMMISSIONERS

October 5, 2016

The Regular Meeting of the Bucks County Board of Commissioners was held this day at 6:00 pm, in the Bucks County Commissioners' Meeting Room, 55 E. Court Street, Doylestown, Pennsylvania. In attendance were Commissioner Robert G. Loughery, Chairman; Commissioner Charles H. Martin, Vice Chairman; and Commissioner Diane M. Ellis-Marseglia. Chairman Loughery opened the meeting with a moment of silence, followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

INTRODUCTIONS

Chairman Loughery welcomed Bucks County's newly appointed district attorney, Matthew Weintraub, as well as county row officers Mary Smithson, Clerk of Courts and Michael Gallagher, Controller.

PROCLAMATIONS

The Commissioners proclaimed October 17-23, 2016 as "BUCKS COUNTY'S HEALTHY COMMUNITIES WEEK." Commissioner Martin read the proclamation, in which the Commissioners thanked NOVA for its support, counsel, and empowerment of crime victims, their family members and friends, while working to eliminate domestic violence here in Bucks County through advocacy, community education and prevention programs.

The Commissioners proclaimed October as "DOMESTIC VIOLENCE AWARENESS MONTH." Commissioner Marseglia read the proclamation, in which the Commissioners encouraged all citizens to work toward ending domestic violence by empowering all people to develop healthier relationships and assisting victims in accessing the information and supportive services they need. A Woman's Place Executive Director Ifeoma U. Aduba accepted the proclamation and thanked the Commissioners for their support.

PUBLIC COMMENT – Agenda Items

Mike Fiore, school social worker in Council Rock, and Tammy Wood, Supervisor of Pupil Personnel in Bensalem School District, thanked the Commissioners and spoke in support of the truancy prevention/diversion contract with K/S Consultants.

OLD BUSINESS

Upon motion of Commissioner Marseglia, seconded by Commissioner Martin, with the vote being 3-0, the minutes for the regular meeting of September 21, 2016 were approved with the requested additions from Commissioner Martin.

NEW BUSINESS

Chairman Loughery read through the agenda, providing clarification and addressing questions and comments.

Item 1g – Children & Youth Director Lynne Rainey responded to Commissioner Marseglia's question about referrals to the district judges. An extensive discussion on the countywide truancy reduction initiative followed, with Ms. Wood and Mr. Fiore providing additional information. Commissioner Martin noted that parents have an obligation to make sure their kids get to school. He suggested that offering financial incentives to the parents could be less expensive than using consultants. Ms. Rainey spoke about truancy referrals from the school districts and the subsequent reduction in referrals to Children & Youth. Chairman Loughery noted his wife's experience with chronic absenteeism as a middle school teacher, and his teenage daughter having to get up so early in the morning to get a bus at 6:15 am. He proposed that truancy could be reduced by starting school later in the morning. Mr. Fiore indicated that this issue is being considered at the state level and many doctors support the idea.

Item 3a – In response to Chairman Loughery's question, Director of Corrections Bill Plantier advised that this is needed to comply with the Prison Rape Elimination Act.

Item 5a – Commissioner Martin inquired about the type of warranty provided with this phone system and the ongoing costs to maintain it. General Services Director Kevin Spencer clarified that this would be added on to the existing contract with Avaya.

EXECUTIVE REPORTS

Brian Hessenthaler, Chief Operating Officer, reported on the following:

Flu Clinics – Two of the three scheduled flu clinics for 2016 have been held: The first one was a few weeks ago in Quakertown where they administered approximately 350 doses; Last Saturday a clinic was held in Levittown with 950 doses being administered. The 3rd and final clinic will be held on Saturday, October 15th in Doylestown.

Voter Registration – The last day to register to vote in the upcoming election is next Tuesday, October 11th.

Drug Take Back Program – Another drug take-back event will be held on Saturday, October 22nd.

Lynn T. Bush, Chief Clerk, reported on the following:

Landmark Towns Community Achievement Awards – A reception was held last week, honoring several people who capture what is so wonderful about Bucks County. The Landmark Towns in Bucks County are Yardley, New Hope, Bristol, and Morrisville. The individuals recognized were Sue Schneck and Tammy Marshall from Yardley Borough, who started the farmers' market; Hal Wilcox from Morrisville Borough, who organized a prayer rally to bring awareness to heroin and addiction; Bob Egan, the impresario for Odette's for many years; and John Burke, recently retired manager for New Hope Borough. These individuals really represent the strength of the arts, culture, and community spirit that we have in Bucks County.

COMMISSIONER COMMENTS

Commissioner Marseglia announced that Dr. Gerald Wydro, who handles our Emergency Health Services, was awarded the Dr. George Moerkirk Memorial Outstanding Contribution to EMS Award at the annual Pennsylvania Department of Health Emergency Medical Services Conference.

Commissioner Martin said Recorder of Deeds, Joseph Szafran and his staff are to be commended for the wonderful Tour of Honor trip to Washington, D.C. This was Commissioner Martin’s third year attending and it was a great day. He noted that he overheard one of the veterans say that it was the greatest day he’s had in the last sixty-six years.

Chairman Loughery also spoke about Mr. Szafran and his staff, citing their work with the Veterans ID Program, their connections to the veterans’ community and Bucks County’s own Tour of Honor. The Chairman shared that he escorted a 101 year old WWII veteran, alongside Commissioner Martin, who escorted a 94 year old WWII Congressional Medal of Honor recipient, as part of the wreath laying ceremony at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier. In response to someone who asked how the trip was being paid for, Commissioner Loughery advised that the County does not pay for it. He pointed out that many community groups and sponsors, including the Warminster Rotary, bands from several school districts, and the Parx Casino, all contributed to the day’s success.
