Park reservations for the County’s cabins, campsites, pavilions, or picnic groves are accepted beginning the first business day after New Year’s Day each year.

Discount Tickets

Throughout the year, the Department offers discount tickets to ski and amusement parks.

Winter tickets (December through March 15) include Jack Frost/Big Boulder, Blue Mountain, Camelback, Elk Mountain, Shawnee, and Bear Creek.

Summer tickets (May through September) include: Dorney Park, Dutch Wonderland, Hershey Park, Morey’s Piers, PA Renaissance Faire, Sesame Place, Six Flags (Great Adventure), Knoebels, Adventure Aquarium, Longwood Gardens, Philadelphia Zoo, Diggerland USA, Elmwood Park Zoo, and Clementon Park.

Important Park Rules

Along with other park rules, **SWIMMING AND ALCOHOL ARE NOT PERMITTED IN ANY COUNTY PARK except the swimming which is permitted only at Oxford Valley Pool and Tohickon Valley Pool.**



25th Anniversary of the Lenape Village at Churchville Nature Center

This is the 25th anniversary of the Lenape Village at Churchville Nature Center. In the year 1991, the village was authentically built the way it would have been in the 1500's just prior to European contact. At that time, none of the Bucks County school districts were studying the Indians who lived in this area. Since it is important to know about local history, the County thought it was important to learn about the first inhabitants of this area before the Europeans arrived. With the help of Dr. Herbert Kraft of Seton Hall University, Dr. Wm. Guthrie of Rider College, John Kraft of Waterloo Village, Mary Ellen Flynn (Lenape lecturer since 1964) as consultants who had all worked with Nora Thompson Dean, a full blood Lenape from Oklahoma, the County was able to develop a program that shows how the Lenape lived in harmony with nature for 12,000 years before the Europeans arrived.

The Lenape lived in Eastern Pennsylvania as far as Harrisburg, all of New Jersey, Southern part of New York and the Northern part of Delaware. This was known as Lenapehoking, Land of the Lenape.

The village contains one wigwam, two longhouses, a sweat lodge, a hunter's debris hut, a food storage pit, a dugout canoe, and a food drying rack. It has 7 stations that show how the Lenape lived. Included is a garden station, cooking station, hunting station, fire making station, family life station, pottery station, and a cordage station. These are all hands-on stations. The students can do all the things that a Lenape child would have done 500 years ago. They learn to be thankful for what they have today, to respect all of nature, to be resourceful and not to waste anything and to share what they have.

Churchville Nature Center has six school districts under contract teaching over 10,000 students a year. They also do public programs, birthday parties, and sleepovers on the weekends. The Center is very thankful to be able to share this information about the Lenape culture with so many people. You can check out their website www.churchvillenaturecenter.org for more information.

There are also Sunday tours for the public **every Sunday 1:00 – 4:00 PM \$8 per person**. Each Sunday features a different station. **October 23rd they will be have a big Fall Festival (“To-ko-king”) 12:00-4:00 \$10 per person**. Sleep-overs and birthday parties are also available on weekends, upon request.





Parks with designated sites include Lake Towhee, Tinicum Park (tent camping only), and Tohickon Valley Park. Fees are charged per day for family campsites, which accommodate a maximum of 6 people. Fees are charged per person for group campsites, which accommodate 10 or more people.

Pavilions and/or Picnic Areas—Rent a pavilion or wooded picnic area in any of our parks for all occasions such as family reunions, birthday parties, company picnics, etc. Pavilions and picnic areas are available for rental in Core Creek, Playwicki, Silver Lake (pavilion only), Tinicum, Lake Towhee, Tohickon Valley, and Peace Valley Parks. Fees vary for residents and nonresidents, and for private versus nonprofit groups and size of the pavilion.

Swimming

Oxford Valley Pool (OVP), located in Fairless Hills, is a 50-meter pool with a maximum depth of 4 ft. 3 in. It features a water slide and small wading pool for children with a depth of 1 ft. 6 in.

Tohickon Valley Pool (TVP) is situated in a wooded park setting in Point Pleasant. The main pool ranges in depth from 3 ft. to 5 ft 6 in., while the children’s pool is a maximum of 1 ft. deep.
