

BUCKS COUNTY COMMISSIONERS

September 19, 2007

The Regular Meeting of the Bucks County Board of Commissioners was held on Wednesday, September 19, 2007 at 10:00 a.m., at the Joseph Ferderbar Elementary School, 300 Heights Lane, Feasterville, PA. In attendance were Commissioner Charles H. Martin, Chairman, Commissioner James F. Cawley and Commissioner Sandra A. Miller. Commissioner Martin opened the meeting with a moment of silence. It was followed by the Pledge of Allegiance with the assistance of Mrs. Compton's 4th Grade Class.

INTRODUCTIONS

Commissioner Martin welcomed everyone and introduced the Joseph Ferderbar Elementary School Principal, Judy Brown. Ms. Brown welcomed everyone and spoke about the School and why she considers it one of the best elementary schools in the district. She introduced Mrs. Compton and her 4th grade class and thanked everyone for coming today.

Commissioner Martin acknowledged County elected officials: William Snyder, Treasurer, Ray McHugh, Controller, Barbara Reilly, Register of Wills, Ed Gudknecht, Recorder of Deeds, Mary Smithson, Clerk of Courts and Patricia Bachtle, Prothonotary. He also introduced Lower Southampton Police Chief William Wiegman.

PRESENTATIONS

Commissioner James Cawley spoke to Mrs. Compton's 4th Grade class about National Preparedness Month. He introduced Harry Crohe of the Bucks County Rescue Squad who assisted him with a "Ready Kids Lesson" on being prepared. They presented each child with a backpack known as a "go-bag" and discussed the various items that would need to be placed in the bag to be prepared for an emergency. Commissioner Cawley and Mr. Crohe, with the assistance of the students, went over ideas as to what items each household should have ready if they needed to leave their home on short notice. They told the children their mission is to act as messengers and help educate their families on what to do and where to go in case of an emergency.

PROCLAMATIONS

The Commissioners proclaimed September 2007 as "NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS MONTH" and September 19, 2007 as "BUCKS FAMILY PREPAREDNESS DAY" urging all Bucks Countians to have emergency plans and supply kits in their home. Lower Southampton Police Chief Wiegman and Harry Crohe, Bucks County Rescue Squad accepted. They spoke about the importance of being prepared in the case of an emergency or evacuation and thanked the Commissioners for their support.

The Commissioners proclaimed September 23, 2007 as "NEW HOPE-LAMBERTVILLE AIDS WALK DAY" throughout the County of Bucks urging all Bucks Countians to support FACT in their goal to maintain the quality of life for those infected by HIV/AIDS and promote awareness of this disease. Mycal Harrison, FACT/ Bucks County Aids Walk organizer and Carissa Liller of Baldi & Jenei, PC (participants in the Team Challenge) accepted. They spoke about the importance of keeping awareness raised and supporting those living with AIDS as well as the great need for funding. They thanked the Commissioners and encouraged everyone to join them in this weekend's walk.

The Commissioner proclaimed October 2007 as "ALZHEIMER'S MEMORY WALK DAYS" and November 2007 as "NATIONAL ALZHEIMER'S AWARENESS MONTH" encouraging all Bucks Countians to participate in the Alzheimer's Memory Walk Days and help all people affected by this disease live happy and healthy lives. Kathy DiSalvo, Alzheimer's Association Delaware Valley Chapter, accepted and thanked the Commissioners on behalf of the Association. She spoke about the statistics of people suffering from Alzheimer's and the effect the disease has on the family as well as the individual. She informed us of the series of fundraising walks, including the Philadelphia Memory Walk on November 3rd at Citizen's Bank Park, and invited everyone to participate.

COMMENDATIONS

The Commissioners and the Bucks County Department of Corrections were presented with a Letter of Commendation from the Pennsylvania Department of Corrections. Tom Schlager, Chief Prison Inspector, Pennsylvania Department of Corrections, recognized the Bucks County Department of Corrections for achieving 100% compliance with State Prison Inspection Standards. He read the September 19, 2007 letter from Secretary of Corrections Jeffrey Beard, addressed to Commissioner Sandra A. Miller, Chairperson of the Prison Oversight Board, acknowledging the accomplishments of the Commissioners, Prison Board and Correctional Facility staff. He added that Bucks has always been a model and a leader and he is proud of what has been done. He congratulated the County and everyone involved for the commitment they made.

Commissioner Miller, Chairperson, Bucks County Prison Oversight Board, thanked Tom and spoke about the importance of establishing and meeting standards. She said this is the County's second consecutive perfect score which wouldn't have been accomplished were it not for the dedicated professionals at the Department of Corrections. She spoke on behalf of the Board when stating that standards and goals were met as a result of the competent staff. She introduced and thanked Harris Gubernick, Director, Bucks County Department of Corrections, who in turn, introduced staff members who were important factors in achieving compliance and thanked them for their hard work.

MISCELLANEOUS

David M. Sanko, Chief Operating Officer, reported on the following matter(s):

Emergency Preparedness Month – Mr. Sanko explained that funding for emergency services not only covers the cost of equipment and professional training, but there is also funding for public education. He explained that private citizens are an important part of emergency services because they are the eyes and ears as to what is unusual in our community. In order to do this, the County has partnered with various state and federal agencies to create a series of awareness programs, such as the “Ready Kids” initiative and a residential newsletter providing information on being prepared for an emergency. Another provision of funding has been to supply laptops for police cruisers to allow law enforcement officers immediate access to information.

Fire Training Center – Mr. Sanko spoke about the new Fire Safety Training Center being built in Doylestown. He said this will be a state of the art facility and the next generation in fire safety training. He added that we soon hope to make some announcements on the new facility in Lower Bucks County which will allow first responders more training time and less driving time. He spoke of the importance and reliance of the volunteers as they are our first line of defense and added that these new training facilities are resources that will help them better protect us.

S.W.A.T. Hazmat Team – The Doylestown Borough Police Department recently partnered with the new S.W.A.T. Hazmat team in order to run exercises. Police Chief Donnelly and the SWAT team ran drills one evening at the Courthouse with equipment and full gear in order to demonstrate how they would take control of the building if there were an actual emergency. This was a huge value to the departments as it allowed them necessary training exercises.

Public Safety Work Group – John Dougherty and Harris Gubernick, co-chairs of the Public Safety Work Group, have been successful as far as working, training and partnering together to build programs. The work group consists of one representative from each discipline of Central, Lower and Upper Bucks as well as participants from respective Chief’s Associations.

Department of Homeland Security – Secretary Michael Chertoff will be in Philadelphia tomorrow visiting the Southeast region (which John Dougherty chairs) to speak about awareness and present an instructional program at City Hall. This has been a phenomenal month in emergency safety as valuable training and education has been provided to law enforcement and emergency services personnel.

PUBLIC COMMENT – GENERAL

Kathleen Saunders, League of Women Voters and Doylestown resident, said she really enjoyed hearing the report on the Bucks Employee’s Green Initiative (“BEGIN”) Program and inquired as to when the report will be officially adopted as the League has partnered with the Sierra club and they look forward to referencing that program and it’s recommendations.

The Commissioner said that they have reviewed the report and will see that it is on the agenda at the next Commissioners meeting.
